



## Frequently Asked Questions about Glenfield's New Recycling Program

### 1. What can be put in the blue recycling bins?

**Answer:** The following materials can be put in the blue recycling bins for collection every two weeks:

- a. Metal cans with lids removed (free of food debris)
- b. Glass bottles with lids removed (free of food debris)
- c. Any plastic bottle that has recycling symbols 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 7 on the bottom
- d. Newspaper, construction paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, printer paper
- e. Junk mail, magazines, catalogs
- f. Corrugated cardboard (must be flattened, cut and no larger than 14"x14")

### 2. I have other materials that aren't on the list to be put in the blue recycling bins. How do I get these recycled? Can I just put these out with my regular recyclables?

**Answer:** If you have the following materials, call Waste Management's "At Your Door" service at **1-800-449-7587** Monday-Friday, 8AM-8PM to arrange a pickup (no additional charge for Glenfield residential garbage customers):

- a. **Televisions**, computers, household electronics
- b. Paint products, thermometers
- c. Garden chemicals, swimming pool chemicals, flammable solvents
- d. Household batteries, fluorescent bulbs, vehicle batteries, televisions, computers, household electronics call.

**Tip:** When calling the above number, tell the representative your name, address and that you are a garbage customer of Glenfield Borough. They will then arrange a pickup date and time to gather your materials.

### 3. Are there any items which will not be recycled by Waste Management?

**Answer:** Biological waste, construction materials, smoke detectors, gas cylinders, ammo, leaking containers, items in containers over 5 gal., E-cigarettes, medicines, tires, fire extinguishers, explosives, unlabeled containers, regular trash, asbestos, unknown materials
